The entrance exam for foreigners (language of instruction (English) and major) is conducted with the aim of identifying language competencies in English, as well as the knowledge and professional skills of entrants who wish to continue their studies at KhSAC for a master's degree in order to improve their professional skills for further creative and performing, pedagogical and scientific activities in the field of in the field of musical art, as well as work in professional musical groups. The entrance exam for foreigners consists of Part I – the language of instruction (English), and Part II – the subject. Based on the results of the two parts, a total score is given, which is the only component of the competitive score for this category of entrants.

PART I LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION (ENGLISH)

The entrance exam program in a foreign language (English) is intended for foreigners and stateless persons who have expressed a desire to obtain an educational degree "MASTER" in the territory of Ukraine and possess the language of instruction (English) to the extent that corresponds to the level of "independent user" according to the classification Pan-European recommendations on language education (level B1-B2).

THE PURPOSE AND TASKS OF THE ENTRANCE EXAM

The purpose of the entrance exam is to determine the level of English language training of foreign and stateless master's degree applicants (hereinafter referred to as applicants) to ensure quality training of foreign and stateless specialists. During the entrance exam, master's degree applicants must demonstrate adequate language, speech and sociocultural competencies.

Linguistic competence involves the applicant's knowledge of phonetic, orthographic, lexical, orthographic, grammatical and stylistic norms of the modern English language.

Speech competence covers the applicant's ability to perceive and reproduce the information in English.

Sociocultural competence involves the applicant's knowledge of country studies and cultural studies, as well as the ability to use this knowledge in various language situations in the process of communicating with representatives of other cultures.

The objects of assessment are speech competence in reading and writing, as well as language lexical and grammatical competence.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ABILITIES AND SKILLS

Components of speech activity are receptive and productive skills.

The candidate's communicative speech competence is manifested in the performance of various types of speech activity, namely: perception, production, interaction or mediation (in particular, oral or written). Each of these types of activities can be associated with texts in oral, written, or both forms.

ANNOTATION OF A GENERAL SCIENTIFIC TEXT

The entrance exam provides for the assessment of written communication skills within the professional needs of students and, first of all, the skills of constructing a written statement (annotation) based on a general scientific text, mastering the necessary lexical and semantic constructions used during the description and analysis of a general scientific text, production of a binding written statement.

An abstract of an article involves, first of all, the ability to fully, accurately and deeply understand the main information of a scientific text, to determine the topic of the text, the order of presentation of information in the text, to interpret the conclusions and assessments of the author, to draw conclusions and to be able to present one's own attitude to the read information.

The abstract should have an introductory paragraph design; accurate transfer of facts, absence of distortion of information; neutrality of judgments/transfer of the author's idea; compliance with coherence and logic; adequate brevity of the text, and correct language design. The recommended average volume of the annotation is up to 500-600 printed characters.

CONVERSATION ON THE TOPIC OF SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH

The entrance exam involves the ability to conduct a dialogue on the topic of the future profession. During the entrance exam, the content and communicative content of dialogic speech, the effectiveness and completeness of the disclosure of the dialogue topic, the adequacy of the provided information, the correct use of lexical units and grammatical constructions, the appropriateness and accuracy of their use in oral speech are evaluated.

The master's degree applicant must show an understanding of the problems of his future profession, and talk about the role of his future research in the development of science, culture, and art in his native country and in Ukraine.

THE PROCEDURE FOR CONDUCTING THE ENTRANCE EXAM

The entrance exam is conducted in accordance with the Rules of admission to the Kharkiv State Academy of Culture in 2024.

THE STRUCTURE OF THE ENTRANCE EXAM

The entrance exam includes three subtests for a comprehensive assessment of the level of formation of language, speech and sociocultural competencies:

- subtest for mastery of grammatical material
- written subtest on text material within the scope of professional activity (type of speech activity abstract of a text of a general or scientific nature);
- an oral subtest based on professional content and taking into account the needs of educational and professional communication (type of speech activity speaking, interview on the subject of the entrant's future profession).

Candidates for admission to the master's degree must be able to analyse and compare information;

- correctly use lexical units and grammatical structures;
- establish logical connections between parts of the text.

During martial law, testing is conducted remotely.

EVALUATION CRITERIA knowledge of foreign and stateless applicants, who enter KhSAC in the 2024/2025 academic year for a master's degree

Knowledge of English as a language of instruction is assessed on a 100-point scale, the starting point is 100 points. The total score of the entrance test is derived based on the scores for each of its components and is 100 points, thus the maximum score of the entrance test can be 200 points. A foreign citizen does not receive a recommendation for enrollment if he scores less than 124 points.

II. ANNOTATING THE SCIENTIFIC ARTICLE ON THE SPECIALTY (50 points)

PART II

PROFESSION

The professional exam is conducted to identify the knowledge and professional competencies of applicants who wish to continue their studies at KhSAC to obtain a master's degree in order to improve their professional skills in further creative, performing, pedagogical and scientific activities in the field of musical art, as well as work in professional concert and music and theatre institutions.

Graduates of higher education institutions of III-IV accreditation levels with a bachelor's degree in music are admitted to study for the master's degree. Applicants must have the necessary level of professional skills, knowledge, abilities and skills in the main special disciplines ("Choral conducting", "Choir class", "Methodology of teaching special disciplines", "Voice setting", "Reading of choral scores", "Arrangement", "Choral literature", "History of choral art", "History of world music", "History of Ukrainian Music", "Musical Aesthetics", "Musical Psychology", etc); demonstrate awareness of the theory and history of music, including choral art, and use professional terminology.

During the examination, the entrant must demonstrate:

Knowledge:

- theory and history of music, harmony, polyphony, musical form, and choral studies;
- processes of development of musical art in a historical context in combination with aesthetic ideas of a certain period;
- genre and stylistic features of the works of national and foreign composers of various schools and artistic directions;
- works of modern choral literature of a polystylistic direction, as well as complex musical language and texture;
- principles, methods, forms and means of working on a choral score;
- principles of creation and implementation of performance interpretation in the professional activity of a conductor-choirmaster;
- the most important areas of development of current problems of conducting in the modern scientific literature;
- basic regularities and modern achievements in the theory, history and methodology of musical art;
- methods of teaching the course "Conducting" in educational institutions;
- technology of performance of choral works that are more complex in style, by means of manual technique.

Skills:

- to express reasonably a personal opinion on the theory and history of national and world musical culture;

- to navigate the literature on the theory, methodology and practice of teaching the course "Conducting" and "Methodology of teaching special disciplines";
- to use freely the conductor's gesture in the process of working on a choral work;
- to work on further improvement of performance skills;
- to conduct works of the polyphonic composition of the texture;
- to make a general, musical-theoretical analysis of the choral score, and construction of the musical form of the work with a detailed consideration of the musical-thematic material and textural presentation;
- to master the skill of intonation and stylistic analysis of modern choral works of various styles and genres and use this analysis in performance interpretation;
- to develop a performance plan of the work and determine specific means for its practical implementation;
- to justify the conductor-performer interpretation, the characteristics of the means of expression (tempo rhythm, dynamics, phrasing, character of deep amplitude, strokes, accents, fermatas, caesura, pause, rubato, timbral features, agogics, determination of partial and general dynamic meaningful climaxes);
- to identify conducting and performing difficulties and ways to overcome them;
- to interpret artistic images in performing and pedagogical activities;
- to interpret compositional work with a choir and perform conducting duties;
- to establish contact with performers during rehearsal and concert work;
- to interact with the audience to convey the artistic concept of the work, to represent one's own performance interpretation freely and confidently.

Abilities:

- fluent conducting techniques and performing means of expression;
- auditory, metro-rhythmic and emotional self-control during a concert performance;
- conducting skills and the ability to improve it through the use of appropriate practical and rehearsal methods.

For the period of martial law, the creative competition is held remotely.

Applicants in advance send a video or access to the links of video recordings (posted on the YouTube platform) of the performance program of the creative competition to the email address of the admission committee.

Requirements for submitted videos:

- 1. an application record is sent by one or more links;
- 2. video recording should be of high quality in terms of sound and visual parameters;
- 3. the name and surname of the performer, the executable program must be signed on the video;
- 4. recording is carried out on a fixed camera without editing and special effects, as well as the performer must be placed in the frame completely in full face;
- 5. the recording should clearly show the instrument, hands and face of the performer. The term (as well as the term of the consultation) will be posted additionally on

the Academy's website (in the section "Schedule of entrance exams").

Creative competition involves the implementation of the graduate program by heart, which in terms of complexity corresponds to the graduate program of the educational degree "bachelor" (conducting program).

During the creative competition, the entrant must demonstrate:

- a high level of technical skill, professional possession of a complex of techniques and means of performing expressiveness;

- artistic and convincing interpretation of choral works, corresponding to genre and style characteristics;

- artistry, high artistic and emotional level of performance of works.

Requirements for the specialty program:

- conducting two choral works contrasting in tempo and character (one composition a caprella and one with accompaniment);

- performance of one vocal work (folk or author's song, romance, aria, etc.);

- piano performance of 1 work of classical or modern repertoire (polyphony, large form and play or etude).

Examination committee takes into account the following set of professional data of the applicant:

- conducting and performing data will, sociability, plasticity of hands, etc.;
- a sense of artistic content, genre and stylistic features of works, form creation;
- expressiveness of phrasing, diversity of dynamics;
- proper possession of technical and performing skills, artistic temperament.

The term of the creative competition (as well as the term of consultations) will be posted additionally on the Academy's website (in the section "Schedule of entrance exams").

The overall score is set on a 200-point rating scale. Applicants who received less than 124 points during the creative competition are not allowed to participate in the competition for enrollment for education.
