Considered and approved at a meeting of the Faculty Council choreographic art Protocol No. 8 dated March 13, 2023 The entrance exam for foreigners (language of instruction (English) and major) is conducted with the aim of identifying language competencies in English, as well as the knowledge and professional skills of entrants who wish to continue their studies at KhSAC for a master's degree in order to improve their professional skills for further creative and performing, pedagogical and scientific activities in the field of choreographic art, as well as work in professional choreographic groups. The entrance exam for foreigners consists of Part I – the language of instruction (English), and Part II – the subject. Based on the results of the two parts, a total score is given, which is the only component of the competitive score for this category of entrants.

PART I LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION (ENGLISH)

The entrance exam program in a foreign language (English) is intended for foreigners and stateless persons who have expressed a desire to obtain an educational degree "MASTER" in Ukraine and know the language of instruction (English) to the extent that corresponds to the level of "independent user" according to the classification Pan-European recommendations on language education (level B1-B2).

THE PURPOSE AND TASKS OF THE ENTRANCE EXAM

The purpose of the entrance exam is to determine the level of English language training of foreign and stateless master's degree applicants (hereinafter referred to as applicants) to ensure quality training of foreign and stateless specialists. During the entrance exam, master's degree applicants must demonstrate adequate language, speech and sociocultural competencies.

Linguistic competence involves the applicant's knowledge of phonetic, orthographic, lexical, orthographic, grammatical and stylistic norms of the modern English language.

Speech competence covers the applicant's ability to perceive and reproduce the information in English.

Sociocultural competence involves the applicant's knowledge of country studies and cultural studies, as well as the ability to use this knowledge in various language situations in the process of communicating with representatives of other cultures.

The objects of assessment are language competence in reading and writing, as well as lexical and grammatical competence.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ABILITIES AND SKILLS

Components of speech activity are receptive and productive skills.

The candidate's communicative language competence is manifested in the performance of various types of speech activity, namely: perception, production, interaction or mediation (in particular, oral or written). Each of these types of activities can be associated with texts in oral, written, or both forms.

ANNOTATION OF A GENERAL SCIENTIFIC TEXT

The entrance exam provides for the assessment of written communication skills within the professional needs of students and, first of all, the skills of constructing a written statement (annotation) based on a general scientific text, mastering the necessary lexical and semantic constructions used during the description and analysis of a general scientific text, production of a binding written statement.

An abstract of an article involves, first of all, the ability to fully, accurately and deeply understand the main information of a scientific text, to determine the topic of the text, the order of presentation of information in the text, to interpret the conclusions and assessments of the author, to draw conclusions and to be able to present one's own attitude to the read information.

The abstract should have an introductory paragraph design; accurate transfer of facts, absence of distortion of information; neutrality of judgments/transfer of the author's idea; compliance with coherence and logic; adequate brevity of the text, and correct language design. The recommended average volume of the annotation is up to 500-600 printed characters.

CONVERSATION ON THE TOPIC OF SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH

The entrance exam involves the ability to conduct a dialogue on the topic of the future profession. During the entrance exam, the content and communicative content of dialogic speech, the effectiveness and completeness of the disclosure of the dialogue topic, the adequacy of the provided information, the correct use of lexical units and grammatical constructions, the appropriateness and accuracy of their use in oral speech are evaluated.

The master's degree applicant should demonstrate understanding of the problems of his future profession, and talk about the role of his future research in the development of science, culture, and art in his native country and in Ukraine.

THE PROCEDURE FOR CONDUCTING THE ENTRANCE EXAM

The entrance exam is conducted in accordance with the Rules of admission to the Kharkiv State Academy of Culture in 2022.

THE STRUCTURE OF THE ENTRANCE EXAM

The entrance exam includes three subtests for a comprehensive assessment of the level of formation of language, speech and sociocultural competencies:

- subtest for mastery of grammatical material
- written subtest on text material within the scope of professional activity (type of speech activity abstract of a text of a general or scientific nature);
- an oral subtest based on professional content and taking into account the needs of educational and professional communication (type of speech activity speaking, interview on the subject of the entrant's future profession).

Candidates for admission to the master's degree must be able to analyse and compare information;

- correctly use lexical units and grammatical structures;
- establish logical connections between parts of the text.

During martial law, testing is conducted remotely.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

knowledge of foreign and stateless applicants, who enter KhSAC in the 2023/2024 academic year for a master's degree

Knowledge of English as a language of instruction is assessed on a 100-point scale, the starting point is 100 points. The total score of the entrance test is derived based on the scores for each of its components and is 100 points, thus the maximum score of the entrance test can be 200 points. A foreign citizen does not receive a recommendation for enrollment if he scores less than 124 points.

PART II PROFESSION

The professional exam is held in order to identify the best ones among those who wish to continue their studies in the master's degree program and gain the necessary knowledge for further creative and scientific activities in the field of choreographic art.

Entrants should have the necessary level of professional skills, possess knowledge, abilities and skills in the main special disciplines: "Folk and stage dance", "Ukrainian folk dance", "Classical dance", "Modern dance"; "Ballroom Dance", "Historical Ballroom Dance" and "The Art of the Ballet Master"; demonstrate awareness of the history of choreographic art, use professional terminology.

During the professional exam, the entrant must demonstrate

Knowledge:

- the main stages of the evolution of choreographic art;
- theories and practices of choreographic art;
- creative heritage of outstanding choreographers and performers of the past and present;
- categorical apparatus of choreography.

Skills:

- analyse the development process of choreographic art;
- describe the creative activity of outstanding choreographers and performers of the past, their influence on the development of Ukrainian and world dance art;
- determine the relationship and mutual influence of various choreographic directions in modern dance art;
- express one's own opinions on the cultural and artistic life of Ukraine and the world;
- create a choreographic act.

Abilities:

- analysis of choreographic works of ballet masters of the past and present;
- analysis of well-known performances of the classical heritage and performances of the modern world ballet theatre;
- analysis of the works of outstanding choreographers from the folk and stage, and in particular, Ukrainian dances, both past and present;
- determination of the main features of the creative activity of famous choreographers and their influence on the development of Ukrainian and world art of dance.
- writing a composition plan;
- analysis of musical material to determine its parts, sentences, musical themes, meter, rhythm, tempo, dynamic shades.

The professional exam is based on the requirements corresponding to the bachelor's degree in the speciality 024 "Choreography" and involves answering questions on the exam card.

The program and form of the entrance exam are the same for all persons entering the "Choreography" speciality.

EVALUATION CRITERIA OF THE APPLICANTS' KNOWLEDGE

Entrants who received an unsatisfactory grade for the test (less than 124 points) **are not allowed** to participate in the competition for admission to full-time or part-time forms of study.
