
Kyiv National I. K. KARPENKO-KARYI University of Theatre, Cinema and Television

The Kyiv National I. K. Karpenko-Karyi University of Theatre, Cinema and Television is one of the leading institutions of art education with its 100 years history.

The University is a cross-disciplinary institution of art education that graduates professional staff in dramatic art of Acting and Cinema-Television. The University includes the Institute of screen arts and Acting Faculty and fifteen departments. World famous art masters of theatre, cinema and television work, directors, actors of Academic theatres, the academicians and corresponding members of the National Academy of Arts in Ukraine work at the premises of the University.

International cooperation in the field of artistic culture is one of the priority directions of activity at the university. The university successfully collaborates with UNESCO Chair IT, the International Theatre Institute, participates in the festivals of dramatic schools in Romania, Spain, China, Peru, Bulgaria, Philippines. The university is a member of the Alliance of Theater Schools WTEA and a member of the Alliance of Film Schools BRIFEA. Students have presented their works at the festivals of Germany, the United States, France, Portugal, Japan, Hungary, Italy, Kazakhstan, Georgia, Armenia, Belarus.

Kyiv National I. K. Karpenko-Karyi University of Theatre, Cinema and Television founded the international student film and television festival "Prologue" and the International Festival of theatre schools "Inspiration."



Olena Aleksandrova Vice-Rector for International Relations

Olena Aleksandrova is a Doctor of Sciences in Philosophy and Professor. She currently serves as Vice-Rector for Research and International Cooperation at the I. K. Karpenko-Karyi Kyiv National University of Theatre, Cinema and Television.


Her academic background spans philosophy, history, psychology, and management.

Lviv National Academy of Arts

The Lviv National Academy of Arts was founded in 1946 on the basis of Lviv Art and Industrial School, known since 1876.

The Academy offers bachelor's, master's, and doctorate degrees in art and design. There are various directions of applied art (ceramics, glass, metal, wood, textile), fine art (sculpture, painting, sacred art, contemporary art), design (interior design, fashion design, graphic design), restoration, cultural studies, art history and theory, art management. Based on these directions, the institution offers a wide range of programs, which are attended by 1200 students from all over Ukraine, as well as international students.

Since February 24, 2022, LNAA has become a hub for art students from across the entire war-torn country.



Vasyl Kosiv Rector


Vasyl has been teaching visual communication since 1998. He graduated from Lviv Academy of Arts and received his PhD from Kharkiv Academy of Design and Arts. In 2003–2004 and 2015–2016 he was a Fulbright scholar in Kansas (KSU) and New York (Columbia). He served as a Deputy-Mayor of Lviv from 2006 to 2013. Vasyl Kosiv defended habilitation thesis in 2019, his monograph was awarded a grand-prix at the national rating "Book of the Year."

In 2021, he was a visiting professor at the University of Warsaw. Since August 2021, Vasyl Kosiv has been a rector of the Lviv National Academy of Arts.

A.V. Nezhdanova Odesa National Academy of Music

A. V. Nezhdanova Odesa National Academy of Music was founded in 1913 and is the first music higher educational institution in Ukraine. The main activities of the Academy is training students to become highly qualified musicians and specialists from a Bachelor to a PhD degree, training and certification of educators, scientific and pedagogical staff; conducting research, methodical, and creative work. The areas of teaching and educational processes are: Piano, organ; Orchestral String Instruments; Orchestral wind and percussion instruments; Folk instruments; Singing; Choral conducting; Opera and symphony conducting; Musicology; Composition; Cultural Studies.



Kharkiv State Academy of Design and Arts

Kharkiv State Academy of Design and Arts has a 100-year history, during which the peculiarities of training specialists in Kharkiv art education were formed.

Now the Academy provides art education in twenty-nine different educational programs at three levels of higher education and has four faculties:

Design: graphic design, industrial design, multimedia design, Environmental design, clothing design (footwear); architecture and urban planning; art therapy and communication practices;

Fine Arts, Decorative Arts, Restoration: graphics, street art and monumental art, easel painting, easel and monumental sculpture, restoration and examination of works of art, art history;

Born in Kharkiv, 1977, graphic designer and design theorist, educated at Kharkiv State Academy of Design and Arts. He has been professionally associated with his alma mater almost 30 years: student, PhD student, Dean of the Faculty "Design", Vice-rector of the Academy, the Rector.

Full Professor, PhD (Design); he was one of the first to defend his PhD thesis on the specialty "Technical Aesthetics" on "Integration of Design and Marketing in Contemporary Design Culture".

Member of the working group at the Ministry of Culture of Ukraine; developed the procedure of obtaining the educational and creative degree of "Doctor of Art" and training in the creative post-graduate course.

Oleksandr Soboliev actively combines administrative, scientific and teaching work with professional activities in various areas of graphic design. His initiative in 2019 contributed to the opening in the Academy of the third in the world unique Museum of Eco-Poster "The 4th Block".


Nina Araya


I am very happy to have this opportunity to be here and open the world of choreography to all of you.

Transcarpathian Academy of Arts

The Transcarpathian Academy of Arts is a post-secondary academic art institute. It was founded in 2003 and is located in Uzhhorod, Ukraine.

The academy was formed with three departments, two of which are graduate departments. Department of Design was founded in 2004 and prepares bachelor and master-level specialists in graphic design, interior design, and environment design. Department of Fine and Decorative and Applied Arts was created in 2004, the department trains bachelor-level students in the following majors: painting, metalwork, ceramics and woodworking. 

The department held the annual national conference "Erdeliv Readings"; since 2008, the Scientific Bulletin of the Transcarpathian Art Institute has been published, where articles in the fields of pedagogy, design, art history and art education are published.



Mykhailo Pryymych Rector

In 1983 studied at the Uzhhorod School of Applied Arts at the department of "Artistic Woodworking". In 1989 studied at the Lviv Academy of Arts, Department of "Artistic Woodworking". In 1998 postgraduate studies at the Lviv Academy of Arts. In 2001 defense of the dissertation "Decorative carving in the sacred art of Transcarpathia of the 18th–19th centuries (History, Typology, Artistic and stylistic features). "2013 doctoral studies at the LNAM.2018 defense of the doctoral dissertation "Church professional painting of Transcarpathia in the second half of the 18th - first half of the 20th centuries: folk tradition, Byzantine canonicity and Western European artistic influences.

Author of 5 monographs, one co-authored work and about 100 scientific publications. Participant of 4 exhibitions and 4 international plein airs. Laureate (2007; 2018; 2024) of the regional prize of Josip Bokshai and Adalbert Erdeli in the field of art history.



Vladyslava Herych Student

I'm Vladyslava — a third-year Graphic Design student. I work with a wide range of visual forms — from fine art to graphic and media design. My approach is based on combining artistic thinking with the structured logic of design. I create digital illustrations and traditional paintings that often explore social and political issues. My practice mainly includes illustrative posters, original sticker packs, postcards, concept art, and animation. I also work in the field of design — developing visual identities, logos, packaging design, and websites.

My works combine various styles — from realism to caricature — using graphic elements and typography. I often mix techniques and approaches from different disciplines, creating new visual languages. My art is characterized by vivid colors, expressive forms, a rebellious spirit, and strong conceptual accents.

My creative practice is always driven by ideas — never by mere "beauty." I create to influence, to shape public opinion, and to foster critical perception. I often turn to satire and caricature, ridiculing social phenomena, human flaws, and politics. I believe that art has no boundaries, and that visual imagery communicates ideas faster than anything else — capable of changing perception itself.

R. Glier Kyiv Municipal Academy of Music

On January 18, 1868, the first music educational institution in Ukraine was founded in Kyiv. Today it is R. Glier Kyiv Municipal Academy of Music.

The founders of the performing arts schools were: pianists Mykola Lysenko, Volodymyr Pukhalskyi, Felix Blumenfeld, violinists Ivan Vodolskyi, Otakar Shevchyk, Mykhailo Erdenko, cellists M. Polyanichevskii, Vladyslav Aloiz, Friedrich Mulert, composer Reingold Glier, choir conductor Georgy Verivka, also Marko Gelis (folk instruments), Yosyp V. Shadek (music theory), Martin Petz, A. Wacker (vocals) and others. Now R.Glier Kyiv Municipal Academy of Music-modern higher musical educational institution, which prepares specialists of the I-III educational and qualification level in the following qualifications: "Piano", "Orchestral string instruments", "Orchestral wind and percussion instruments", "Folk instruments", "Voice ", "Choir conducting", "Musicology", "Jazz studies".



Iryna Polstiankina Head of the Educational and Methodological Department

Pianist, collaborative pianist and a musical and public figure, teacher. Honored Artist of Ukraine (2018). She graduated from the Voroshilovgrad Pedagogical Institute (now Luhansk, 1986), where she worked as colloborative pianist and as a teacher. Since 1998 she is working at the R.Glier Kyiv Municipal Academy of Music: since 2008 — Head of the Educational and Methodological Department, Associate Professor, Curator of the Academy's international creative projects and exchange programs ERASMUS+.

Since 1999 she has been the Executive Director of the International Competition for Young Pianists in Memory of Vladimir Horowitz and President of the International Charitable Foundation of the Vladimir Horowitz Competition. She was Executive Director of the International Festivals "Kyiv Summer Musical Evenings" (since 1999), "Virtuosos of the Planet" (2006-2010), the International "Summer Music Academy" (since 2000; all Kyiv). She contributed to the high-level International Festival dedicated to the 100th anniversary of the birth of Vladimir Horowitz (Kyiv, New York, Moscow, 2003), with the participation of the Prizewinners of the Vladimir Horowitz Competition. Since 2009 she has been participating in the annual General Assemblies of the World Federation of International Music Competitions and the European Union of Youth Music Competitions. On the initiative and with the support of the World Federation of International Music Competitions, she organized and facilitated a special competition in memory of Vladimir Horowitz in Geneva (Switzerland, 2023).




Oleksandra Do Student


The scope of her scientific interests embraces theoretical problems of fabric design and fabric formation process on looms, textile design, felting, ergonomics, psychology, including psychological aspects of teaching under current challenging circumstances (covid, war, online teaching), cross-disciplinary innovations in research and teaching, and leadership in education. She is an Organizing Committee General Chair of the International scientific and practical conference "SYNERGY OF SCIENCE AND BUSINESS IN THE POST-WAR RESTORATION OF KHERSON REGION".

National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture

The Ukrainian State Academy of Arts was founded on December 18th, 1917. Its foundation marked the existence of a sovereign country. The founders of the Academy contributed to the creation of the new state symbols of Ukraine. Thus, V. Krychevsky and H. Narbut were the authors of the first banknotes, stamps, military uniforms, fonts, and heraldry of the young country. They interpreted the ancient princely trident of Volodymyr the Great as a symbol of the new Ukraine. In the early years, a solid foundation was laid for the development of painting, graphics, and sculpture. A solid foundation for national artistic pedagogy was formed. Taras Shevchenko's dreams of art education in Kyiv were given a chance to be expressed in classical visual forms.

The National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture is a recognized leading artistic and educational center of the country. The Academy is committed to the innovative creative research and identification of modern artistic trends. It cares about the preservation of classical achievements in art education and about the education of professional artists who honor the classical basic knowledge in drawing, painting and plastics. The historical achievements and current state of the leading art institution in Ukraine confirm that it meets the high status of the Academy in all aspects of its activities. The total number of students is over 1000. The Academy maintains extensive international relations with art schools around the world. Within the framework of such cooperation, the Academy carries out extensive exhibition activities outside Ukraine, and invites foreign artists and teachers to hold exhibitions, lectures, and master classes. The Academy's teachers undergo internships abroad and participate in international scientific conferences. Today, the Academy's graduates represent the Ukrainian academic school on all continents, working in creative and teaching positions.


The main focus of the Academy's international activities and its internationalization remains the training of foreign students and stateless people. The Academy is developing cooperation on academic mobility of teachers and students, participation in EU educational programs, launching joint double degree programs based on an agreement with a partner university, etc.



Oleksandr Tsuhorka Rector

Born in 1973 in the Zakarpattia region of Ukraine, Tsuhorka graduated from the National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture in 2001. Since 2008, he has served as Professor at the Department of Painting and Composition, and in 2019 became Head of the Monumental Painting Department. In 2021, he was appointed Rector of the National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture.

His creative practice spans over 300 works of easel painting and numerous monumental projects. Among his notable works are the mural paintings for Mykola Prytysk Church in Kyiv (1996), the decorative panel Allegories of Arts (2001), and over 50 icons for the Church of the Intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Mamayeva Sloboda (2002–2009). As a production designer at the Taras Shevchenko National Opera and Ballet Theatre (2010–2011), he created stage designs and costumes for the ballet Lord of the Borysfen by Yevhen Stankovych. His later projects include the decorative panel Apotheosis of Arts (2017) and the Memorial Museum of the Artist and Teacher Mykola Storzhenko (2018).



Uliana Pashkova Student

I am a multidisciplinary artist and proactive student at the National Academy of Fine Arts and Architecture in Kyiv, where I study Free Graphics and Illustration. My art practice mixes traditional printmaking with experimental methods and often explores memory, identity, the body, and transformation — on both personal and collective levels.

At my academy, I help younger students as a buddy, support them in adapting, and sometimes organize small workshops to share printmaking techniques with others.


She is the executive editor of the scientific professional journal Art & Design. She has authored more than 200 scientific and methodical works, textbooks, monographs, articles in scientific journals, lecture notes and reports at international scientific conferences on problems of fashion design.

Kharkiv State Academy of Culture

Kharkiv State Academy of Culture (KhSAC) is a dynamic, forward-looking institution of higher education that prepares students for professional careers in a wide variety of fields of activity, such as communication and information, business and administration, social work, culture and arts. Its unique feature is that education in such different study areas is carried out in one academic complex with strong interdisciplinary links, which has made it possible for the Academy to become one of the top centres of culture and education in Ukraine.

Established in 1929, KhSAC had long been the only higher education institution providing competent specialists for the cultural sector of Ukraine. The Academy offers a broad range of bachelor and master degree programmes in 14 subject areas (specialities) of 7 fields of study: "Culture", "Art", "Teacher Education", "Management and Administration", "Journalism and Information", "Specific Categories", "Service Sector". Over the years of its existence the Kharkiv State Academy of Culture has educated about 40,000 professionals, including more than 400 international students from 42 countries of Europe, Asia, Africa, Latin America. Many international graduates of KhSIC occupy top positions at ministries and cultural institutions in their countries.

The education process in the Academy is aimed at the formation of a creative attitude to the chosen major, to the development of practical skills which enable graduates to solve professional problems in the most effective way. The main object of teaching is to develop in future specialists the systemic approach to the solution of complicated technical and social situations, strategic thinking, social and professional mobility, life long striving for self-education and self-improvement.



Nataliia Riabukha Acting Rector

Nataliia Riabukha, Doctor of Art Criticism and Professor, has served as Acting Rector of the Kharkiv State Academy of Culture since 2022. Born in Kharkiv in 1977, she graduated from the B. Lyatoshynsky Kharkiv Music College and the Kharkiv National University of Arts as a pianist, teacher, and accompanist. Affiliated with the Academy since 2001, she combines academic scholarship with teaching and leadership.

She defended her PhD thesis The Miniature as a Phenomenon of Musical Culture (2004) and her doctoral dissertation The Transformation of the Sound Image of the World in Piano Culture (2017). The author of over 130 scholarly works, including the monograph The Sound Image of the World (2016), her research focuses on the philosophy of sound, musical aesthetics, and piano performance.


Since 2017, Dr. Riabukha has held various leadership roles within the Academy, and as Acting Rector, she actively promotes Ukrainian culture through international cooperation and academic partnerships, positioning the Academy as a center of cultural resilience and innovation.

Mykhailo Boychuk Kyiv State Academy of Decorative and Applied Arts and Design

The Kyiv State Institute of Decorative Arts and Design named after Mikhail Boychuk was founded in December 1999 on the basis of the Kyiv Art and Industrial College. However, the "young" institute can not be considered, because it is based on the old traditions of Ukrainian national art. The institute begins its pedigree with the Drawing School of Mykola Murashko, the Kyiv Art School (1900-1920) and the Kyiv School of Applied Arts (1938 - 1957), which became the first professional school for such light-emitting Ukrainian painters as Nikolai Pymonenko, Alexander Murashko, Ivan Їжакевич, Foty Krasitsky, Kazimir Malevich, and later Alexander Arkhipenko and Ivan Kavaleridze, Anatoly Petrytsky and Oleksandr Ekster and painter-boy chemist Ivan Padalka and Vasyl Sedlyar.

The works of pupils and teachers are kept by museums of Germany, Australia, the USA, Canada, Italy, Poland, Russia, Romania, Hungary, Japan, Syria, Czech Republic and other countries. Teachers and graduates of the educational institution are authors of numerous works of art, their compositions are decorated with interiors of the palace "Ukraine", VL Vernadsky National Library, Kiev railway station, metro stations "Golden Gate," "Minsk," metro stations "Khreshchatyk" "(Ceramic panels), the Kyiv Museum of Medicine (Tripot's "Holodomor"). Among the teachers of the institute are those who participated in the revival of the Kiev shrines: St. Michael's Cathedral, the Assumption Cathedral of the Kiev-Pechersk Lavra, the monument to Princess Olga, Yaroslav the Wise; authors of monuments to Vladislav Gorodetsky, Leonid Bykov, park sculptures.

On 25 March 2024, Russian forces bombed the Mykhailo Boichuk Kyiv State Academy of Decorative Applied Arts and Design. This attack serves as a stark reminder of the targeted destruction of Ukrainian art and cultural institutions amidst the ongoing war on Ukraine. The bombardment not only caused structural devastation to the campus buildings but also put the safety of students and employees within the academy at risk. Reports indicate severe damage to the school's gym, painting studios, conference hall, and other facilities.



Kateryna Nahirniak Senior Lecturer at the Department of Graphic Design

Kateryna's professional experience includes working in publishing houses as a graphic designer, in television projects as a production designer, and in an international media publisher, where she was engaged in the full cycle of video content production for social media.

Her creative practice is distinguished by its versatility and the combination of various forms of art. Experience in the field of media and visual content has contributed to the development of dynamic artistic thinking, the ability to work in a fast-paced environment, and a commitment to high standards of quality.


Her professional interests include contemporary ceramics, multimedia art, and graphic design.

Luhansk State Academy of Culture and Arts

It was founded on April 8, 2002, according to the decision of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine, as "Luhansk State Institute of Culture and Arts". On April 2, 2012, according to the order of the Cabinet of Ministers of Ukraine, the educational institution was renamed to "Luhansk State Academy of Culture and Arts". Until 2014, the Academy had three divisions — the Children's Academy of Arts, the College, and the Academy itself. The Academy had three faculties — culture, music and fine arts.

In 2014, after the temporary occupation of Luhansk by LPR gang formations, according to the order of the Ministry of Culture of Ukraine No. 966 of November 10, 2014, the educational institution was relocated to Kyiv. Students of the academy who expressed a desire to continue their studies in the educational system of Ukraine continued their studies at the material and technical and educational and production base of the Kyiv National University of Culture and Arts. The National University of Bioresources and Nature Management provided a dormitory for students of the Academy.

In October 2024, the State Service for the Quality of Education, as the central body of the executive power of Ukraine, which implements the state policy in the field of education, in particular on issues of ensuring the quality of education, published an updated rating of educational institutions of Ukraine that have a high degree of risk. In particular, the Luhansk State Academy of Culture and Arts was included in the list of educational institutions with a high degree of risk.



Yuliia Kholmakova Representative of International Relations Department

Yuliia is a Senior Lecturer, International Relations Department representative.

She has been a senior lecturer at Luhansk State Academy of Culture and Arts since 2006, currently teaching English for professional purposes to bachelor's level students in fields such as acting and music. From 2007 to 2014 directed an amateur English theatre at the Department of Translation and Psycholinguistics, adapted and staged plays by British and American playwrights. In cooperation with actors and stage directors organized thematic events dedicated to English-speaking cultural holidays like Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas etc., enriching students' understanding of diverse traditions.



Estonian Academy of Arts Tallin, Estonia

Founded in 1914, the Estonian Academy of Arts is the oldest and only public university of visual culture in Estonia. The Academy offers over 30 curricula in the four faculties of Architecture, Design, Art Culture and Fine Arts.

1200 students from all parts of the world are engaged in studies and research to cultivate their analytical abilities and critical thinking with the aim to develop into environmentally and socially conscientious creators. They are taught by lecturers and instructors who are professionals in their field – internationally recognised artists, architects, designers, and scholars who provide unique, individualised study and personal mentorship in an interdisciplinary and synergetic atmosphere. EKA is listed among Top 200 Architecture and Design Universities by QS World University Rankings.

The Estonian Academy of Arts' new building, designed by its alumni, was inaugurated in 2018 and has since received over ten awards for its architecture, including interior design. Located between the picturesque UNESCO world heritage medieval Old Town and the vibrant and hip Kalamaja districts, the Academy stands as an oasis of art culture in the midst.



Anne Pikkov Vice-rector for Academic Affairs

Anne is an experienced administrator, educator, and Art Director with a robust trajectory of contributions to both industry and academia. She joined the Estonian Academy of the Arts as a visiting teacher in 1998; she has been leading the Continuing Education Department since 2006 and in addition took on the position of Vice-Rector in 2014. Anne serves on several boards as part of her service to the profession, including qArted of Nordic-Baltic Network, the Estonian Academy of Arts Foundation, and The Union of Estonian Graphic Designers.

Anne is the recipient of numerous awards for her work as a children's books illustrator and designer; her publications and work are included in exhibitions nationally and throughout Europe on an ongoing basis. In 2016 she was recognized with the "Raisin of the Year" award for most extraordinary children's book. Anne holds a BA and MA degree in Graphic Design from the Estonian Academy of the Arts.



Sandra Mell Head of International Relations

Sandra has been involved in several projects and networks regionally and globally, and is currently also active in ELIA PIE group. On February 24, 2022, on Estonian Independence Day, EKA decided to open its doors and hearts to Ukrainian refugee students and she was a keen and vocal advocate, among many in ELIA, for opening the mobility funding schemes (i.e ERASMUS and Nordplus) to the ones in need the most this year. She is a believer in international education and convinced that mobility and exchange, also ERASMUS programme (perhaps without its too high ambitious digitalisation aims) will make this world still a better place.

Royal College of Music Stockholm, Sweden

The Royal College of Music, Stockholm (Swedish: Kungliga Musikhögskolan i Stockholm) is the oldest institution of higher education in music in Sweden, founded in 1771 as the conservatory of the Royal Swedish Academy of Music. The institution was made independent of the Academy in 1971 and is now a public authority directly under the Ministry of Education and Research. Vice-chancellor from June 2019 is Helena Wessman, former general manager of Berwaldhallen.



Anna Maria Koziomtzis Head of Academy

Anna Maria Koziomtzis is an esteemed music education professional with extensive experience in leadership, academic management, and performance arts education. Based in the Greater Stockholm Metropolitan Area, she currently holds the position of Head of Academy at the Royal College of Music (Kungliga Musikhögskolan) in Stockholm, a role she has fulfilled since July 2018. In this capacity, she oversees the Academy of Classical Music, Composing, Conducting, and Music Theory, contributing significantly to the institution's academic and artistic direction. Prior to her current position, Anna Maria was Head of Department at the Royal College of Music from July 2015 to June 2018, where she provided strategic and operational leadership. Her earlier tenure at the University of Gothenburg further highlights her robust academic background. From October 2013 to July 2014, she served as Senior Lecturer and Acting Head of Department at the Academy of Music and Drama. Between 2006 and 2012, she held roles as Senior Lecturer and Senior Faculty Administrator, specializing in the Opera and Musical Theatre programs. Anna Maria's academic qualifications include a Master of Fine Arts (M.F.A.) in Music Education from the University of Gothenburg. She is well-regarded for her expertise in lecturing, musical theatre, and curriculum development, with her skills endorsed by peers and colleagues across institutions.

Polish-Japanese Academy of Information Technology Warsaw, Poland

PJAIT is a university founded in 1994 by the Foundation for the Development of Information Technology, established on the basis of an agreement between the governments of Poland and Japan in 1993. It was entered into the register of non-state higher education schools by the decision of the Minister of National Education of November 30, 1994.

PJAIT offers education at the bachelor's, engineer's, master's, postgraduate and doctoral levels. It has the right to award the academic degree of doctor of technical sciences in computer science and mechanics, as well as doctor of fine arts in the discipline of fine arts. Its educational offer includes studies in: Computer Science, Informational Management, New Media Arts (Graphics Design), Interior Design, and the Culture of Japan.

The university has signed agreements with 31 universities in Europe and 7 in Japan regarding student exchange. It also has agreements related to teaching staff and conducting joint research, projects, training and organizing scientific conferences.



Anna Eichler Artist and educator

Anna Eichler is a visual artist and educator working in the Faculty of New Media Art at the Polish-Japanese Academy of Information Technology in Warsaw, Poland. She specialises in oil painting and mural painting. In PJAIT, Anna Eichler teaches Visual Literacy – Drawing and Colour, Illustration, and Mural Design and Techniques. She is the leader in foundation teaching for the zero-year and first-year graphic design students, working with them during regular classes and international workshops, like Social Design Course, Creativity! and Open-Air, among others.


In the past five years, Anna Eichler has had two individual exhibitions, participated in group exhibitions, and, as the art director of Redsheels, produced and painted over 15 murals in Poland with her crew. One of her most important projects is 'Women of Liberty' in Gdańsk – a 400 square meters mural commemorating the vital role that women of all ages and classes played in the Solidarity movement in Poland. Redsheels – the female mural painting crew supported women in the mural industry and trained them in mural painting, production and design, realising art and social design projects or grass-root projects, rather than painting advertisements.

London Contemporary Dance School London, UK

London Contemporary Dance School (informally LCDS) is a contemporary dance school located in London, England. Previously part of the Conservatoire for Dance and Drama, since 2022 LCDS has been independently registered with the Office for Students. It was founded by Robin Howard in 1966 to train new dancers for his company, London Contemporary Dance Theatre.

London Contemporary Dance School and its partner company, London Contemporary Dance Theatre, were founded in 1966 under the governance of the Contemporary Dance Trust. After receiving support from its founder, Robin Howard, the Contemporary Dance Trust moved to 17 Duke's Road in 1969, which it renamed The Place. In 1982, LCDS began offering a BA Honours degree in Contemporary Dance, validated by the University of Kent.

LCDS teaches a variety of contemporary dance techniques including release-based, Limón, Humphrey and Contact Improvisation, as well as dance and performance styles including hip-hop/groove, authentic jazz, circus skills, flying low and South Asian dance techniques. As part of its courses LCDS also offers pilates, body conditioning, free electives in Choreology, Anatomy and Scenography, and ballet studies. The course is developed on the principles of periodisation, a training method developed from sport science using the strategic planning of training, performances, and rest periods to optimize physical and psychological wellbeing. LCDS provides both undergraduate and postgraduate vocational training as well as a PhD research programme in contemporary dance.



Josh Slater Director of Higher Education


Josh Slater is Director of Higher Education: Pedagogy & Enhancement at London Contemporary Dance School, The Place, and a dance artist-researcher. He has over a decade of experience across universities and conservatoires, specialising in curriculum innovation, quality enhancement and inclusive teaching practice. His doctoral research at Coventry University's Centre for Dance Research explores falling as a choreographic practice of risk, resilience and repetition. Josh publishes in peer-reviewed journals and edited collections, serves as Assistant Editor for *Choreographic Practices*, and contributes to the sector as an external examiner, trustee and mentor.

Film Univeristy Babelberg Konrad Wolf Potsdam, Germany

It is a place of independent research, teaching and art. Founded in 1954, it is Germany's largest film school with an international reputation.

In July 2014, it became the first German film school to achieve university status. With its unique interdisciplinary educational profile, successful productions and innovative research projects, the film university makes a decisive contribution to the future of moving image media. Knowledge and insights, innovative audiovisual formats, as well as services, technologies, ideas and experiences are transferred to companies and society. In addition, the only art university in the state of Brandenburg is a place of cultural and political debate.

Not only as a place to study, but also as a place to work, the Filmuniversität Babelsberg is inspiring and versatile, offering creative as well as dedicated people an excellent working environment. It is an integral part of Babelsberg's media city with close ties to Berlin. There is no other place in Germany where film history, present and future are so concentrated together. The university also benefits from the efficient science and research structure of its immediate surroundings. Potsdam is the city in Germany with the highest density of scientists - each of the major German research communities is represented here.



Susanne Stürmer President

Dr Susanne Stürmer is president of Film University Babelsberg KONRAD WOLF since October 2013. Prior to this, she was Managing Director at UFA, Germany's largest Film and TV production company. In October 2011 she became part-time professor at Film University, teaching new media / online production. Susanne Stürmer studied Economics, holds a PhD in this field and has long experience in media and film.

Film University Babelsberg received university status in June 2014. Since being president, Susanne manages the process of sharpening the university's unique profile together with all members of the university. While further strengthening the successful film development and production work of the school, the Film University builds her research profile with the three pillars art, technology and science. From September 2016, a new scientific/artistic PhD amends the program. In parallel a number of new and innovative teaching and research programs and formats, also integrating external partners, were developed. Susanne puts a strong effort in tightening the relationship between the school and the film and media companies in Germany and worldwide as well as between the film schools in Germany.

Susanne Stürmer is vice chair of the board of the media industry network media.net in Berlin-Brandenburg, elected representative of the state of Brandenburg at the advisory board of ZDF (largest public broadcaster in Germany) and member of the arbitration committee of the broadcaster ARD. Since December 2016 she is a member of the ELIA Representative Board. In November 2022, she is running for election to become President of ELIA.

Berklee College of Music Valencia Valencia, Spain

Since 2012, Berklee College of Music has also operated a campus in Valencia, Spain. Berklee València is the Berklee College of Music's first international campus, housed in the Palau de les Arts Reina Sofía. Queen Sofía Palace of the Arts is the final structure built as part of a grand City of Arts and Sciences concept designed by the Valencia-born and internationally known architect Santiago Calatrava, which began construction in 1995 and was opened on 8 October 2005.

Berklee's campus in València regularly offers unique programs in contemporary music. These include clinics, workshops, and seminars as well as short, concentrated sessions in areas such as performance, flamenco, film scoring, music business, technology and production, and education.

It also offers a two-week summer performance program in addition to the five-week program in Boston.



Simone Pilon Executive Director

Simone Pilon is the executive director for Berklee Valencia, responsible for the vision, strategic direction, and day-to-day operations of all areas of the Valencia campus. She is charged with the development and execution of Berklee's academic strategy on the Valencia campus, including new programs and partnerships, career development and student success efforts, and community outreach. Prior to assuming this role, Pilon served as dean of academic affairs at the Valencia campus, where she played a leading role in academic strategy, overseeing the graduate and undergraduate programs, academic records and services, library, and technology. Pilon joined Berklee Valencia in 2020. She previously served as chair of Berklee's Liberal Arts Department in Boston, serving students at both Berklee College of Music and Boston Conservatory at Berklee. Prior to Berklee, Pilon worked as a professor of French and director of international studies at Franklin College in Indiana. As a faculty member, she taught French language and literature as well as interdisciplinary and study abroad courses. As director of international studies, she led campus internationalization efforts, including developing and nurturing partnerships and overseeing short-term and faculty-led study abroad programs. Pilon co-edited the book Woodstock Then and Now: A 50th Anniversary Celebration (Clemson University Press) with Berklee faculty member Alex Ludwig. She also prepared a student edition of Louis Hémon's novel Maria Chapdelaine with Molière and Company. She has published articles and book reviews in international journals and has served as a technical reviewer for the series of CliffsNotes, Dummies, and Everything books. She has presented on topics relating to French language and literature, pedagogy, and internationalization at national and international conferences. Pilon has traveled, studied, and worked internationally, including as a Fulbright-Hays scholar to Morocco and Tunisia. She holds a PhD in Québécois literature from Université Laval and an MA in French literature from McGill University.

HKU University of the Arts Utrecht, The Netherlands

HKU University of the Arts Utrecht, the Netherlands, distinguishes itself with higher education in the arts and media. 

Therese Kruse Director of Educational Administration


I am the Director of the Educational Administration Department which includes the International Office.

Mary Jane Jacob Director

Abakanowicz Charitable Foundation

Mary Jane Jacob is a curator and writer who championed public, site-specific, and socially engaged art in the US as a shared practice and public discourse through the landmark exhibitions "Places with a Past" and "Places with a Future" in Charleston, South Carolina; "Culture in Action" in Chicago; and "Conversations at the Castle" during the Atlanta Olympics. Previously as chief curator of the Museum of Contemporary Art in Chicago and Los Angeles, she had staged some of the first US shows of American and European artists. Then probing creative practioners' relationship to audiences and society she co-edited Buddha Mind in Contemporary Art, Learning Mind: Experience into Art, Chicago Makes Modern, and the Chicago Social Practice History Series. Her book, Dewey for Artists, published by the University of Chicago Press, narrates these themes as lived and promoted by the socially progressive American philosopher John Dewey. Professor at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, her major touring exhibition of avantgarde Polish artist Magdalena Abakanowicz will open at Tate Modern in London in November 2022.



Verinoka Skliarova

General Director of the NGO ART DOT, founder of Art Therapy Force

Veronika Skliarova is a Ukrainian cultural manager, theatre producer, and art curator whose work sits at the intersection of artistic innovation and health care. Director general of the NGO ART DOT and the founder of Art Therapy Force, a pioneering initiative that integrates trauma-informed art practices into Ukraine's cultural and educational sectors. Art Therapy Force works with multimodal approaches in art therapy, collaborating with universities, hospitals, and international partners to train artists and therapists in supporting communities affected by war, displacement, and trauma.

Skliarova is also the program director of Parade-Fest, a multidisciplinary festival based in Kharkiv that explores themes of identity, inclusion, and civic engagement through performance and public art. Notable theatre productions are: "Crimea, 5 a.m.," (Kyiv-London), "With fire and rage" (Liverpool), and "Lesia. History" (Lviv), etc which have been staged across Ukraine and Europe. Following the full-scale invasion in 2022, she launched Anthology24, a collection of contemporary Ukrainian theatre texts that document the cultural and emotional landscape of wartime Ukraine. In 2023, she participated in the Scotland–Ukraine Art Residencies program at Cove Park, focusing on the global dispersion of Ukrainian art and the resilience of cultural identity in exile. Following the residency results, she curated the second day, "Migration" of the main event on culture strategy in Ukraine, the Congress of Culture. Project Healing Arts week in Lviv has become an important Arts and Health event in Ukraine. Veronika is the WHO research coordinator on "Arts and Health asset map". Through her multifaceted work, Skliarova continues to shape Ukraine's cultural response to crisis, using art as both a tool for resistance and a pathway to healing.




Christopher Bailey

World Health Organization & cofounder of the Jameel Arts and Health Lab

Christopher Bailey is the Arts and Health Lead at the World Health Organization and a cofounder of the Jameel Arts and Health Lab. The lab focuses on the evidence base for the health benefits of the arts by building up a global network of research centers to look at effective practice as well as the foundational science of why the arts may benefit physical, mental and social wellbeing. The emphasis of the program is supporting underserved communities around the world. Through its Healing Arts activities, the program also engages with the global media and communities to promote pro-health messaging and build solidarity on health issues through all media. Educated at Columbia and Oxford Universities as well as the American Academy of Dramatic Arts, after a career as a professional actor and playwright, Bailey joined the Rockefeller Foundation as their Research Manager, and from there was recruited to WHO where he lead the Health Informatics work and later their on-line communications team before starting the Arts and Health program.

As an ambassador for the field, Bailey has also performed original pieces such as Stage 4: Cancer and the Imagination, Strangers in Time: transgenerational trauma and the arts, and The Vanishing Point: A journey into Blindness and Perception, in venues around the world, from the Hamwe Festival in Rwanda, to the Wellcome Collection in London, to the World Bank in DC, as well as Lincoln Center and Carnegie Hall in NY, the LA Opera, LACMA, and Warner Bros Studios in LA, and the Conservatory of Music in San Francisco, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Budapest Opera, the National Theatre of the Ukraine, and the Kennedy Center among many others. The basic message of his work is to amplify the WHO definition of health which states that health is not merely the absence of disease and infirmity, but the attainment of the highest level of physical, mental and social wellbeing. The arts have uniquely evolved to do just that.




Maria Hansen European League of Institutes of the Arts (ELIA)
